4. ENTRIES

4.1 Closing Date for Entries

Standard Entries Close on: 1700 hrs Tuesday, April 15, 2025 Late Entries Close on: 1700 hrs Wednesday, April 16, 2025

4.2 Entry Procedure

Those wishing to take part in this Indu Chandhok Memorial South India Rally 2025 must submit their entry to the organisers as mentioned in Art.2.3 above. The same may be collected via an app/form as prescribed by the organiser/fmsci.

4.3 Number of Competitors Accepted

The maximum number of entries accepted is **55**. If by the close of entries, the organizers receive more entries than the maximum number specified in the Supplementary Regulations, then priority is given to the entries of Championship Registered Drivers.

4.4 Classes

I. INDIAN NATIONAL RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

Cars homologated in the current calendar year will be notified by a Bulletin issued by the FMSCI. These cars can take part after a cooling of period 30 days from the date of Homologation/TDF or as decided by the FMSCI.

For the above Championship a minimum of 5 cars to be registered in the beginning of the Championship.

INRC Women

Driver must be a Female

Must compete in INRC 3

No separate entry fees

No minimum number of cars to be registered

Co-Driver points for INRC Women class will be allotted only for Female Co-Drivers amongst Co Drivers

FMSCI Challenge

FMSCI GYPSY Challenge

Open to Maruti Gypsy vehicles and will run as per the FMSCI Gypsy Challenge Regulations. Cars competing in FMSCI Gypsy Challenge will not be classified in the INRC Classifications.

FMSCI Classic Challenge

Up to 2000 cc cars homologated prior to 31st December 2007.

FMSCI Classic Challenge Regulations.

Cars competing in FMSCI Classic Challenge will not be classified in the INRC Classifications.

The FMSCI reserves the right to introduce any other class/classes that will run as support class/classes to the INRC but will not be classified in the INRC classification.

4.7 Refunds

Entry fees will be refunded in full only:

- To competitors whose entry has not been accepted
- In the case of Rally not taking place

The organizers may refund 50% of the entry fees to those competitors who, for reasons of "Force Majeure", duly accepted by the Organising Committee, were unable to start in the Rally.

5. INSURANCE

5.1 Insurance cover with FMSCI Permit

Competitors: A maximum of 250 competitors with valid FMSCI Competition Licenses participating in various events across the Country on a given day are covered for

Personal Accident Insurance for Rs. 5 lakhs with Rs. 5 Lakhs medical expense extension per person.

Officials: A maximum of 100 officials officiating in various events across the Country on a given day are covered for Personal Accident Insurance for Rs.25 lakhs with Rs.5 lakhs medical expense extension per person.

All competitors must possess valid high-risk insurance with hospitalization benefits preferably a cashless policy for a minimum of Rs.10 lakhs.

5.2 Third-Party Public Liability Insurance taken by the Organising Club /FMSCI

The Organising Club /FMSCI have taken a third-party public liability for Rs.5 crores incurred during the running of the rally for injury to third persons or damage to public property.

5.3 Exclusion of Insurance Cover

The Service and Reconnaissance vehicles, even those bearing Special Plates supplied by the organizers are never considered as official participants of the Rally. They are therefore not covered by the Insurance Policy of the Rally and will remain the sole responsibility of their owners.

5.4 Accident Reporting

If a driver taking part in a rally is involved in an accident in which a member of the public sustains physical injury, the driver concerned must report this to the next radio point as specified in the road book and signposted on the route according to Article 53 of GP. If he fails to observe this rule, the Stewards may impose on the crew responsible, a penalty which may go as far as disqualification. The laws of the country must also be complied with in relation to procedures at accidents.

5.5 Rally Cover Insurance for Competing Vehicles

The competing vehicles must possess Rally Cover Insurance valid from 25-Apr-25 to 27-Apr-25.

6. ADVERTISING AND IDENTIFICATION

6.1 Competition Numbers, advertising and Driver's and Co-Driver's names

These will be in accordance with Articles 27,28 & 29 of the **2025** FMSCI General Prescriptions for Stage Rallies and Art.8 of Specific Regulations for INRC.

6.2 Organizers optional advertising

These will be in accordance with Art.8.2 of the 2025 Specific Regulations for INRC.

6.3 Space for Organizers optional advertising

Space for the Organizer's advertisement must be reserved on the car, unless the higher entry fees as per Art. 4.5 are paid.

6.4 Advertising in Service Park Bay Area

Display of advertisements by teams & participants, in their respective Service Park Bay Area, must be confined to the inner walls of the Bay. Any advertising space other than the inner walls will need the prior permission of the organizer's and cost Rs.50 Per Sq Ft. Organizers shall have the discretion to refuse or cancel permission at any point in time.

6.5 Hospitality Area

Teams and Manufacturers can put in multiples of 20 x 20Ft Hospitality Areas based on availability as confirmed by the organiser. The cost of the space is capped to max Rs.100 Per Sq Ft. the cost for this rally is Rs.50 Per Sq Ft. Organizers shall have the discretion based on first cum Frist serve and available area.

6.6 Championship Identification and Advertisement.

Should comply to GP 29.5 as per Appendix IV of the SR.

7. TYRES

7.1 Tyres Specified for use during the rally

Tyres shall confirm to Appendix IV of FMSCI General Prescriptions.

8. FUEL

Free as per 2025 Technical Regulations for Rallying.

9. RECONNAISSANCE

9.1 Procedure for Registration

Crews must report to Rally Headquarters for registration prior to commencing reconnaissance. They must submit details of the reconnaissance car.

Each crew will be issued with two vehicle identification cards which must be displayed on the top of the co-driver's side of the front windscreen and on the co-driver's rear side window during reconnaissance, and a pass valid for up to TWO passages over each special stage. This pass must be carried in the reconnaissance vehicle, shown to and endorsed by an official at the start and finish of each special stage during reconnaissance.

9.2 Specific and /or National Restrictions

9.2.1 For all competitors, reconnaissance will be carried out in accordance with the FMSCI General Prescriptions with a maximum of 2 passes over every stage in accordance with the reconnaissance schedule given in Appendix II.

- **9.2.2** Reconnaissance outside the schedule will be considered a very serious offence and will be reported to the Stewards who may apply sanctions.
- **9.2.3** Reconnaissance will be conducted strictly in accordance with the published schedule. No late entry into a stage for reconnaissance will be permitted.
- **9.2.4** Maximum speed allowed on all special stages during reconnaissance is 45 Kmph except Super Special Stage.
- **9.2.5** Crews must have the vehicle headlamps switched on while traveling on special stages during reconnaissance.
- **9.2.6** Crews are only permitted to enter a special stage from the start points shown in the road book and will NOT under any circumstances drive in a direction opposite to that of the rally, unless instructed by an official of the event.
- **9.2.7** Crews must stop at the Start and Finish (and other locations where instructed) of the stage where rally official will endorse the crew's reconnaissance pass card.
- **9.2.8** Penalties for excessive speed

Refer Art. 34.2 of the 2025 FMSCI General Prescriptions.

Pre-event press conference / interaction will commence at 1400 hrs.

12.2 Finish Procedure

Rest of the cars will report to Finish Park Ferme and remain there till official final classification or instruction by Stewards of the meet.

While the cars are between Podium Finish to Final Scrutineering location, they will travel under Park Ferme regulations and will be observed by marshals.

16. PROTESTS & APPEALS

16.1 PROTESTS

The protest fee is Rs.18,000/= + 18% GST. Total Rs.21,240/= for National Championship

The Protest fee is Rs.12,000/= + 18% GST. Total Rs.14,160/= for Cups, Challenge and Series

If the protest requires the dismantling and re-assembly of different parts of a car, the protestor must lodge an additional deposit. The additional deposit for a protest involving a clearly defined part of the car (engine, transmission, steering, braking system, electrical installation, bodywork, etc.) Rs. 11,800/= (including GST) per part.

The expenses incurred for the work and by the transport of the car shall be borne by the claimant if the protest is unfounded, or by the competitor against whom the protest is lodged if it is upheld.

If the protest is unfounded, and if the expenses incurred by the protest (Scrutineering, transport, etc.) are higher than the amount of the deposit, the difference shall be borne by the claimant. Conversely, if the expenses are less, the difference shall be returned.

Note: all fees are inclusive of taxes applicable in India.

16.2 APPEALS

Appeal Deposit: Rs.96,000/= + 18% GST. Total Rs.113,280/=

Competitors may appeal against decisions, in accordance with the stipulations set out in Articles 15.1 of the Code.

Competitors, Drivers or other licence-holders that are addressees of a stewards' decision or that are individually affected by such decision, whatever their nationality, shall have the right to appeal against that decision before the ASN of the country in which it was given. They must, however, under pain of forfeiture of their right to appeal, notify the Stewards of the meeting in writing within one hour of the publication of the decision, of their intention to appeal.

The right to bring an appeal to the FMSCI along with the Appeal deposit expires 96 hours from the moment the stewards are notified of the intention to appeal on condition that the intention of appealing has been notified in writing to the stewards within one hour of the publication of the decision.

This appeal may be brought by fax or by any other electronic means of communication with confirmation of receipt. Confirmation by a letter of the same date accompanied by the necessary fee is required. The FMSCI will give its decision within a maximum of 30 days.

All parties concerned shall be given adequate notice of the hearing of any appeal. They shall be entitled to call witnesses, but their failure to attend the hearing shall not interrupt the course of the proceedings.

The confirmation of an appeal to the FMSCI must be accompanied by a deposit of Rs.96,000/- +18% GST. Total Rs.113,280/=.

This fee becomes due from the moment the appellant notifies the Stewards of the intention of appealing and remains payable even if the appellant does not follow up on the declared intention to appeal.

If the appeal is rejected or it is withdrawn after being brought, no part of the fee shall be returned.

If judged partially founded, the fee may be returned in part, and its entirety if the appeal is upheld.

If it is proved that the author of the appeal has acted in bad faith, the FMSCI may inflict upon them one of the penalties laid down in the Code.







Appendix VI Extracts from FIA Appendix L

FIA International Sporting Code:

1. Helmets

When the use of an FHR, according to Article 3 below, is mandatory, drivers competing on rally special stages, registered on the FIA Calendar, must wear crash helmets homologated to one of the following FIA standards:

- 8859 (Technical List N°49),
- 8860-2004 or 8860-2010 (Technical List N°33),
- 8860-2018 or 8860-2018-ABP (Technical List N°69)

No helmet shall be modified from its original specification as manufactured, except in compliance with instructions defined by the manufacturer. Accessories must be fitted in accordance with the helmet manufacturer instructions. Only accessories approved by the FIA shall be used. Any other modification or addition of non-approved accessories (helmet cameras, visors, etc.) will render the FIA helmet homologation void.

2. Flame-resistant clothing

On special stages of rallies, all drivers and co-drivers must wear overalls as well as gloves (optional for co-drivers), long underwear, a balaclava, socks and shoes homologated to the FIA 8856-2000 standard (Technical List N°27) or FIA 8856-2018 standard (Technical List No 74).

Embroidery sewn directly onto the overalls shall be stitched onto the outermost layer only, for better heat insulation. Backing material of badges and thread used for affixing them to the overalls must be flameproof.

Substances which may circulate in any cooling system worn by a driver are restricted to water, or air at atmospheric pressure. Water systems must not require the saturation of a garment in order to function.

3. Frontal Head Restraint (FHR)

The wearing of any device intended to protect the head or neck and attached to the helmet is prohibited, unless the device has been homologated according to the FIA 8858 standard. Homologated FHR systems are listed in the FIA Technical List N° 29.

FHR systems must be worn only with FIA-approved items according to the following chart:

4. Safety Belts

Drivers must be properly restrained in their seat by safety belts in conformity with the technical regulations for the vehicle concerned, at all times during a competition when it is mobile on a circuit, pit lane, special stage or competition course.

5. Wearing of jewelry

The wearing of any type of jewellery, such as but not limited to, neck chains, bracelets or watches is prohibited during the competition. Exceptions to this rule, providing the CMO and/or Medical Delegate do not consider that due to size or location they may delay rescue or hinder emergency care, are:

- i. the wearing of watch(es) by co-drivers, on the condition that the watch(es) is worn over the overall,
- ii. the wearing of a single band-style ring providing it does not restrict the natural range of motion of the hand, and
- iii. the wearing of body piercing(s) providing they are not worn in and/or around the oral cavity.

Nevertheless, it is highly advisable that Competitors review the Drivers' Equipment requirements and/or standards set in Appendix L, Chapter III of the 2025 FIA International Sporting Code.

Appendix 7 – Safety Tracking System

TrackRace Safety Tracking

About the System

TrackRace is a vehicle communication system that automatically transmits warnings and vehicle status data from car to Race Control as quickly as possible

The use of TrackRace for these events is based on their use of a reliable GSM network and GPS satellite network, the system's ability to relay status and location through efficiently.

Installation of the System

There is a detailed installation guide attached, here are some KEY items you should be aware of.

Installation Kit: The car installation kit has to be purchased one time by the competitor for the INRC season by contacting the TrackRace team. You will receive a kit that consists of the wiring loom, Console kit with buttons for SOS, OK and yellow flag. This needs to be installed in the car well in advance. The units provide screw mounting holes to mount if you want to prepare your car ahead of time and use a better mounting location.

FULL TIME Power: The units need to run full time power, not switched power. The power lead for the unit is about two metre long.

Unit Placement: The ideal location for the unit is in the centre of the car. It is crucial that the unit is visible to the co-driver while on stage.

Understanding the unit

It is important to understand that TrackRace does NOT replace the normal rally procedure. You must still display an OK sign if you're are OK and you must still SEE an OK sign before continuing past a car stopped on stage. When you approach a car stopped on stage or your car is stopped on stage, here are the options you will see.

S.O.S. (Red – Toggle Switch): This means the crew is **NOT OK** and needs help. **YOU MUST STOP**. The SOS is automatically selected in a high energy impact. If you are the first car to stop at a SOS and confirm it is a RED CROSS situation, manually upgrade to SOS status on your unit as well. Continue following normal procedures and send information on to the next radio point. If you are stopped in stage and require immediate assistance activate the SOS button.

Hazard (Yellow – LED with Buzzer): This means there is a Hazard on the stage ahead. **This COULD mean the stage is completely blocked** and you may have to stop. This is the default status when a car stops on stage.

OK (Green – Momentary push switch): This means you are ok and the stage is clear for following cars to continue. Press and hold upto two seconds to confirm. The ok button can be used to acknowledge when a Hazard flag is received on the console.

Collecting/Returning the Tracker Units

The tracker units should be collected from TrackRace team by paying a security deposit during documentation or before scrutiny. We will collect back the tracker units at the end of the event. Please

be prepared to disconnect the power wires to the unit. The security deposit will be refunded when the unit is returned sealed and in working order.

TrackRace Car Installation Kit Components

The TrackRace Car Installation Kit includes:

- · TrackRace Installation and Car Installation Kit Instruction Sheet;
- · 12V wiring loom with plug and inline fuse
- Console kit having SOS, Hazard and OK switches and alert buzzers.

(The TrackRace Tracker Unit is not a part of the Car Installation Kit and will be available at documentation or scrutiny)

12 Volt Power Supply (Please read this carefully)

TrackRace requires a continual reliable power supply from 9 to 24 volts DC, for your safety and continuity of service, it is imperative that the unit is connected to an un-switched supply on the battery positive terminal or the battery positive side of the isolation switch, insure that power is supplied to

the unit at all times. Do not use an ignition switched power supply. We recommend that a 5 amp (Max) blade type or similar quality fuse is used at the battery supply end of the TrackRace power lead. O volts or Battery negative can be picked up at any suitable earthing point providing the isolation switch does not switch the negative side of the battery.

The TrackRace unit has an internal battery that is kept charged via the cars power supply, it is only there as a reserve supply to power the unit in an accident situation where the cars power supply is interrupted. ie: car battery smashed or dislodged.

As the TrackRace unit is aware of movement and its location; it will automatically go into power save/sleep mode 15 minutes after no movement is detected, however, the unit will continue to function is when it is sending Hazard type signals while on stage. The unit will be "woken" up by pressing any button or by movement of the car.




Photo of Connections and Terminals



A minimum of 100mm of TrackRace Power Supply Cable and Console cable should be left at the unit mounting location for connection to the unit.

Unit Mounting

The preferred mounting method for the TrackRace Console unit is bolted through the dash (with a 3mm aluminium backing plate), in a protected central location, easily seen and accessible by both the driver and co-driver/nav. Photographs of the best mounting options and positioning are below. An alternative mounting method for the TrackRace Console unit is on the roll cage.

The TrackRace Tracking unit should be mounted in center of the dashboard towards the windshield with wires preferably coming from the left side of the dashboard.

These photos are an example of Preferred Method, Dash Board positioning.

Appendix 8 – Start Sequence

- CAR IS LINED UP AT START LINE **50** CMS BEFORE THE BEAMS.
- WHEN THE CAR STOPS AT THE START LINE, THE MARSHALL IS HOLDING A SMART TIMING DEVICE IN WHICH HE CAPTURES A TIME & STARTS A COUNTDOWN FOR A FUTURE TIME TO RELEASE THE CAR AS PER THE RUNNING SCHEDULE.
- WHEN THE TIMER STARTS
 MARSHALL GIVES CALL FOR 60
 SECS, 30 SECS, AFTER 10 SECS HE
 CONTINUOUSLY GIVES A SHOUT.
- WHEN COUNTDOWN TIME REACHES 3 THEN 1 YELLOW LIGHT POPS-UP ON SCREEN.
